This is positively impacting on the quality of their performance in games, gymnastics, dance, OAA and athletics. This has been commented on by teachers in their feedback reports. ▪ Children in KS1 and EYFS have benefitted from the introduction of fundamentals in developing essential physical literacy skills ▪ The ease of use and comprehensive nature of the schemes of work, have supported the successful delivery of PE across the school by teaching staff
