

## LO – To use adjectives and adverbs

Yesterday you looked at the story of Rapunzel and acted it out or retold it to someone in your house.

Today I would like to make the story more interesting. It hasn't got many **adjectives** or **adverbs** and I need you to think of some.

**Adjectives** - describe a **noun**. They can be colours, size, or explain how things look or feel. Red, hot, tall, fluffy, hungry, angry.

**Adverbs** – describe a **verb**. They explain how something was done and usually end in y. He ran **quickly**. She shouted **noisily**.

Year 1s – Draw the witch, Rapunzel, the lettuce, the castle, Rapunzel's hair, the prince and the thorns.

Underneath each picture write a list of **adjectives** to describe them.

Year 2s – Write five sentences that have a **noun phrase** and an **adverb**. For a challenge use an **expanded noun phrase**.

Here is an example - Rapunzel **slowly** let down her **long, golden** hair.

If you have colouring pencils, underline the **adjectives** in orange and **adverbs** in green.
